

- 1. Welcome to the Meadow Trail. This 1/2 mile self-guided trail will take you past Hornhill Orchard and into Hornhill Meadows Local eserve. Follow disks across the events field and through the land in the hedgerow.
- 2. This fenced enclosure is where the old Hornhill Farm the Second World War bat the semains can still be cu seen beyond the fence line. The path you are stood on was originally part of the old Hornia Talarmstead and the stones laid dow path. Contin.
