

Worcestershire County Economic Summary

Comment: The claimant count decreased in November 2021 by 265 to 13,025 and the number of claimants aged 18-24 decreased by 105 to 2,145. Comparisons with March 2020, prior to the impact of the pandemic, show that the claimant count has increased by 4,720 or 57% and the number of claimants aged 18-24 has increased by 550 or 34%. Enhancements to Universal Credit as part of the UK government's response to the Coronavirus meant that an increasing number of people became eligible for unemployment-related benefit support, although still in work. Consequently, changes in the Claimant Count from April 2020 until October 2021 would not be wholly because of changes in the number of people who were not in work.
