We fulfil the P } À Œ v ure qui ferment to restrict Early Years and Key Stage 1 classes to a maximum of 30 and prefer to keep our numbers below this if possible.

Requests for admission treception made after the normal round of admissions, from 1 September or for places other Year Group should be made directly to School Admissions. Subject to the Class Size restriction of 30, where the year group is full a place may still be offered providing

- x there is an Education, Healthand Careplan (EHCPI) place
- x the child is $Z o \} \} I (Š (OELA))$
- x no other applicants (other than those prioritised through EHC an/obr being a CL)A have been refused places in the same year group they herever they live
- x the child is living or moving into the Z } pr[ority area (evidence will be required)
