For the purposes of this policy, a looked after child living with a family where at least one of the carers is Catholic will be considered as Catholic. The carer must forward a copy of their own Catholic Baptismal or Reception certificate directly to the school in order for this priority to be given to the child as failure to do so will result in the looked after child being ranked as a-**Gath**olic.

For all applicants the definition of a brother or sister is:

- x A brother or sister sharing the same parents
- x A halfbrother or halfsister, where two children share one common parent

- x Adopted or fostered children

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If the request is refused, the original application for the normal age group class will progress through the Local Authority coordinated admissions scheme, be considered by **ltbe**al Governing Bodynd the parents advised of theutcome.

If the request is agreed and the year group for which the parents have requested a place is a current year group in the school, then the application will be considered by Ltbeal Governing Bodynd the parents advised of the outcome.

If the request is agreed and the year group for which the parents have requested a place is for a future year group, ie Reception in Septemb2025, then the original application is withdrawn and the parents must submit a fresh application for Recepti2025 when applications open in the autumn term 2024. Please note that parents only have the right to -apply for a place. Where theocal Governing Bodagrees to consider an application for Reception the following year, that application is considered alongside all other applications received and parents will be advised of the outcome of that application on national offer day. No place is reserved or helfor the child in advance.

You are encouraged to ensure that your application is received on time.

#### CHANGE IN PREFERENCE

Once parents have submitted their preference, they will not be allowed to change them without an exceptional change in their circumstances, for example, if the family has recently moved address or an older sibling has changed schools. All requests to **geapr**eferences should be made in writing to the Local Authority to whom the parents submitted the original application. Where a change of preference is submitted for an oversubscribed school, without an exceptional change in circumstances, then the application will be refused.

#### WAITING LIST

In addition to their right to appeal, children who have not been offered a placeuat\_ady of Mount Carmel but were offered a school that was ranked as a lower preference on their application form will be added to a waiting list. The waiting list will be maintained until the last day of the summer t2025 and will then be discarded.

Inclusion on the waiting list does not mean thaplace will eventually become available. It may be that those already offered places may accept them, thereby filling all available places.

Children who are the subject of a direction by the Local Authority to admit or who are allocated to a school in accordance with the Fair Access Protocol take precedence over those on a waiting list.

#### IN YEAR FAIR ACCESS PROTOCOL

The Local Governing Body f Our Lady of Mount Carmes committed to taking its fair share of children who are vulnerable and/or hard to places set out in locally agreed protocols. Accordingly, outside the normal admission round theocal Governing Body empowered to give absolute priority to a child where admission is requested under any locally agreed protocol. Lobal Governing Body as this power, even when admitting the child would mean exceeding the published admission nusubject to the infant class size exceptions.

There is no charge or cost related to the admission of a child to this school.
