

Worcestershire County Economic Summary

Comment: The claimant count increased in June 2023 by 160 to 10,870 and the number of claimants aged 18-24 decreased by 10 to 1,855. The Worcestershire rate (Ages 16-64) of 3.0% is lower than that of the West Midlands (4.9%) and England (3.8%).

Comparisons with March 2020, prior to the impact of the pandemic, show that the claimant count has increased by 2,565 or 31% and the number of claimants aged 18-24 has increased by 260 or 16%.
