#### Meningitis

The UK Halth Security Agencynd leading meningitis charities are urging students to make sure they have been vaccinated against meningitis and other diseases before the start of the academic year.

The NH\$MenACWYmmunisation programme for schools is offeredallopupils in year 9 and 10. UKHSAvaccine coverage datshows around 1 in 8 new students going to college and university this year remain unprotected against these 4 strains of meningococcal bacteria, each of which can cause long term disability, serious health complications and can be life threatening.

We are urging all students to make sure they are up to date with all free routine NHS vaccines, and to know the signs and symptoms meningitisand septicaemiæs it could help save a life.

## All secondary school pupils eligible for free flu vacainminder

On 4 Julythe government confirmed that all secondary school pupils in England will be offered a free flu vaccine from September for the 2023 to 2024 season.

An initial list of groups eligible for this year's flu vaccine was first announced in May. The governmen has confirmed it is expanding the programme to over three million pupils in secondary school years 7 to 11, who will be offered the vaccine as a nasal spray through their school's vaccination programme from 1 September.

NHS school aged immunisation services will be undertaking the vaccinations from September during the autumn term. All primary school children and infants aged two and three will also be offered the flu vaccine. Eligible groups are urged to take up the offer from September before the flu season begins to give themselves the best possible protection in winter.

UKHSA have recently shared guidance on the secondary school vaccination programme, and other school-based routine immunisations. Secondary school resources to share with parents are also available.

A local schoolage immunisation provider will contact your school to agree a date for the vaccination session and the best approach for implementing the programme.

## International Day of Clean Air for Blue Skieseptember

It's the International Day of Clean Air for Blue Skies on 7 September.

This year the theme isogether for Clean Air. The day aims to raise awareness and enable actions to improve air quality. Everyone has a part to play to find new ways of **doings**, to reduce the amount of air pollution we cause, and ensure that everyone, everywhere can breathe clean air. Air pollution is one of the biggest environmental risks and can lead to stroke, heart and lung disease, cancer and respiratory problems. It can also exacerbate conditions such as asthma, including in children.

Air pollution comes from a number of sources, including vehicles, household energy use, industrial facilities and industry, wildfires and the burning of waste.

This year in Worcestershire, we are asking people to take action. We are asking that parents don't leave their engine idling especially around schools, and instead consider walking, wheeling, cycling or using public transport for journeys instead of using the car.
