Keep Me Safe

The [Keep Me Safe Strategy](#) was launched in Worcestershire in July 2023. It aims to provide consistent and coordinated messages to practitioners across Herefordshire and Worcestershire about a particular safeguarding theme to reduce the numbers of children who are seriously injured or die across the two counties. [Keep Me Safe When I'm Sleeping](#) is in place, with a range of resources available to support practitioners. [Keep Me Safe When I'm Crying](#) is currently being developed, but resources are already in place to support practice.

This funding is applied for once an academic year. Payments received begin the term which you have applied for, and will continue for subsequent terms, until the end of that same academic year. Payments will be received at the end of each term, in line with your payments for each term, and will be shown on your NEF statements.
