- 3.4.1.4. Children living outside the catchment area of our school who, at the time of application, attend one of our linked primary schools (Tenbury Primary Academy or Lindridge Primary School).
- 3.4.1.5.Children living outside the catchment area of the school who live closest to the school, based on the same LA measurement as described in 3.4.1.3 above.
- 3.4.2. If there are not enough places to satisfy all applications under any one criterion, priority will be given in accordance with proximity to the academy as per criterion 2.4. Where two or more applicants live an equal distance from the academy and it is not possible to differentiate between them, priority will be determined by a random allocation process. This process will be independently verified by someone independent of the academy and OAT.

Once a child has been identified for admission to the academy under the Fair Access Protocol, the academy will notify the local authority within seven calendar days of the decision to accept or refuse the FKL @dontsion.
- 3.5.3. It the academy refuses entry, the local authority may request a direction from the Secretary of State. The decision of the Secretary of State will be binding upon the academy.
