




* GVA = Gross value added is an economic productivity metric that measures the contribution of a corporate subsidiary, company, or municipality to an economy, producer, sector, or region

This also highlights the distribution of jobs in the individual districts of Worcestershire County to determine which areas currently have the most jobs available and are likely to see the most growth in the future.







From 2020-2021 there has been an increase in the number of businesses (+55 businesses).

Worcestershire's rate of increase (+5.5%) compares to a +2.0% increase for the England average and a +1.7% increase for the West Midlands region.

The top 3 Health and Care subsectors in Worcestershire are: Other human health activities, General medical practice activities and Child day-care activities.
