BY THIS ORDER:

- The public right of way over the land situated at Himbleton and shown by a bold continuous line on the map contained in this Order and described in Part 1 of the Schedule to this Order shall be stopped up on the date of confirmation of this order, and thereupon the County of Worcestershire definitive map and statement shall be modified accordingly.
- Notwithstanding this Order any statutory undertaker as shall for the time being have statutory powers in that respect shall have the right to open up the land referred to in paragraph 1 to install, maintain or alter their apparatus.
- 3. There shall on the date of confirmation of this order be a public footpath over the land situated in Himbleton described in Part 2 of the Schedule and shown by a bold broken line on the map attached to this Order, and thereupon the County of Worcestershire definitive map and statement shall be modified accordingly.
- 4. The County of Worcestershire definitive statement shall be modified as described in Part 4 of the schedule of this Order.
- 5. The rights conferred on the public under this Order shall be subject to the limitations and conditions set out in Part 3 of the Schedule.

Remarks




