Subject: Strong Objection to Proposed Sand and Gravel Quarry at Lea Castle Farm

Dear Sir/Madam

I am writing to voice my strong objection to the proposed sand and gravel quarry at Lea Castle Farm. As a resident of the newly developed Lea Castle Village, I am deeply concerned about the profound negative impacts this quarry will have on our community's quality of life, property values, and the safety and well-being of our children and families.

Firstly, the quarry's proximity to current and future school sites is particularly alarming. Not only are there several schools near the planned location, but a new school is set to be built directly opposite the proposed quarry site. This means our children will be exposed to harmful dust and particulates while playing in school playgrounds and participating in school activities. Well-documented, and it is entirely unacceptable that our children's health and quality of life should be compromised in this way.

Moreover, the quarry's operations, including up to 150 HGV movements per day between 7 a.m. and 7 p.m., will disrupt our quiet residential environment and pose severe safety hazards. Lea Lane, which is planned to become a primary road, will become a heavy goods route, posing a significant risk to vulnerable road users, including children cycling to school and other amenities. The impact on our older children commuting to Wolverley, in particular, would be immense, turning what should be safe routes into highly dangerous pathways.

In addition to these safety concerns, the environmental and visual impact on our local area is significant. The natural beauty of Lea Castle Farm will be completely decimated by this development.

The overall value of the area will decline in the quality of life for everyone in the area.

I can see NRS persistently pushing this proposal, despite the community's consistent objections. The reduced volume of objections this time around is not due to a lack of concern but a reflection of the false reassurance given to those who protest. This approach by NRS appears to be a deliberate tactic to wear down residents, hoping we will simply accept the proposal out of frustration. However, I assure you, our stance against this quarry remains firm, and we will continue to oppose it.

The needs and well-being of the local community should be prioritised over industrial gain. A quarry on this site would permanently alter the character and safety of our village, and it would put our children's health at risk.

I will protect the interests of the local community and its future generations.
